Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you and your families are well. As we approach the end of term, I am writing to inform you of some important updates that will come into effect after the Easter break. These include adjustments to our behaviour policy and a move to our summer uniform.

Summer Uniform Expectations

From the first day back after Easter, students will be expected to wear the school's summer uniform, which consists of:

- Year colour polo shirt **OR** white collared shirt and tie with a year coloured jumper
- Blazer
- Black school trousers (**leggings and tracksuit bottoms are strictly forbidden**)
- Black school shoes or **plain black** trainers (Crocs are strictly forbidden)
- A suitable school bag

Items Not Allowed

The following items are **not permitted under any circumstances, please do not send your child to school in these items:**

- Leggings
- Tracksuit bottoms
- Crocs or other non school footwear

Students arriving in any of the above will be sent to the Reflect Room until the issue is resolved. **We strongly encourage all families to use the Easter holidays to ensure that students have the correct uniform ready for the new term.**

Behaviour Policy Updates

Please also note the following amendments to our behaviour policy, which will take effect after the Easter break:

- **Stage 4 Lesson Referral**
A Stage 4 referral- issued when a student is removed from a lesson due to persistent disruption that has not been resolved at Stages 1–3 - will now result in an **afterschool detention the following day.**
- **After School Detentions**
Standard detentions remain 20 minutes in length. However, if a student receives more than five detentions within a half term, every detention from the sixth onwards will be 40 minutes.



All detentions are recorded on Class Charts the day before, ensuring parents receive at least 24 hours' notice. Please ensure you have the Class Charts Parent App set up so that you are kept fully informed.
