Immanuel College is an oversubscribed, thriving, and highly-successful Church of England 11-18 academy. Our Christian vision is very important to us as it means our students will develop within a caring, Christian environment. Our last faith inspection shows that we are an outstanding Church Academy and we are currently graded by Ofsted as Good.

The vast majority of our students choose to stay on after year 11 and join our thriving Post -16 provision.

Collective Worship & PSALM



Immanuel College follows the Church of England vision for collective worship that it should be inclusive, invitational and inspiring. Our approach takes inspiration from the ‘warm fires and open doors’ metaphor where students are invited to approach the Christian message, inspired to move closer and included however near or far they wish to come.

The Psalms in the Bible are songs in which, amongst praising God, the writer asks questions of God about how we should live our lives. PSALM (Personal, Social And Life Matters) at Immanuel College is our version of PSHE where students have the opportunity to explore big questions about life, tackling social, moral, spiritual and cultural (SMSC) issues.

Throughout the academic year our students will be invited to take part in activities, assemblies, lessons and workshops that are all aimed to reinforce themes of equality, diversity, inclusivity and mutual respect.

Student Guidance

Each student’s academic and pastoral experience is monitored by their Form Tutor, Head of Year and Pastoral Managers. The Form Tutor’s main responsibility is to get to know the students in the form group so that progress can be regularly supported and monitored. Students will see their tutor every day during Collective Worship time.

We place a great emphasis on the role of Heads of Year and their teams in raising levels of student achievements as well as promoting excellent levels of attendance and good behaviour. Annual consultation evenings are held for each year group for families to meet with teachers to discuss students’ progress and to set targets.

Post-16

Immanuel College provides a comprehensive, fully-inclusive education for all our post-16 learners, with pathways to suit all abilities, interests and individual career aspirations.

Our curriculum is broad and balanced and offers students not only excellent academic routes, but also a wide range of exciting extra-curricular opportunities. We have built aspiration and challenge at its core so that students are able to flourish in their educational journey.

Results are consistently excellent, with students achieving well over national and local averages in both A level academic and vocational qualifications.

Our Christian values of perseverance, character and hope run through our pastoral and enrichment programme. Our welcoming atmosphere, caring Christian ethos, supportive pastoral team, modern facilities, and outstanding results makes Immanuel College a fantastic place to learn.



All of our students progress to their chosen universities, exciting apprenticeships and employment at leading organisations.

As part of the school's recent £4 million expansion, a brand new sixth form building opened in September 2025.

This state-of-the-art extension provides six modern classrooms, social study areas, a common room, and a dining room complete with catering facilities.

Designed with sustainability in mind, the new facilities are environmentally friendly and energy efficient, helping to cut carbon emissions and reduce running costs. We are delighted to now be able to offer our students these outstanding new spaces.
