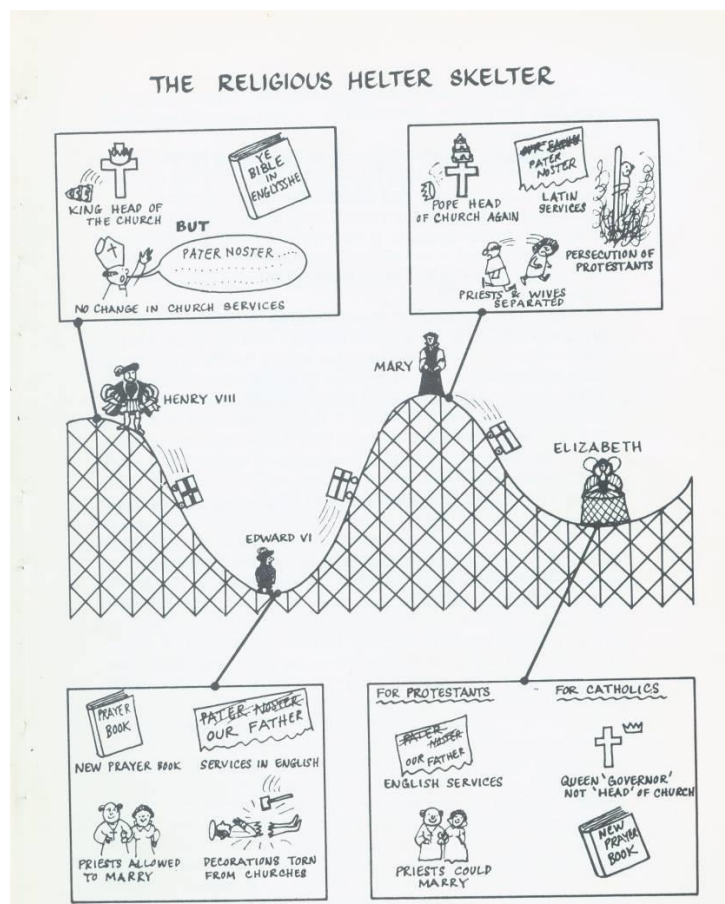


How much did religion change in the Tudor period? Instructions

- 1) Read the information about the Tudor kings and queens on the next page.
- 2) Use this information to help you design your own rollercoaster, showing the changes in religion each king or queen made. It **must** contain:

- The names of the kings and queens.
- What their religion was.
- 4x things they believed/did with the Church in their reign.
- Then you can make the rollercoaster more fun/exciting.

- 3) Which Tudor king or queen made the most changes to the religion? Explain why you have picked them.
- 4) Why are Elizabeth I's religious changes seen as trying to be fair? Look at what the other kings and queens tried to introduce.

Henry VIII-
1509 - 1547



Started off as a strong Catholic, until he wanted a divorce.

Replaced the Pope as Head of the English Church.

Introduces the Bible in English.

Keeps church services in Latin.

Doesn't allow priests to marry.

Church buildings remain the same.

Edward VI-
1547 - 1553



A strong Protestant.

Remains as Supreme Head of the Church.

Changes the church services to English.

Allows priests to marry.

Church buildings changed to be more Protestant.

Mary I- 1553 -
1558



A strong Catholic.

Declares the Pope is head of the Church.

Changes the services back to Latin.

Replaces the English Bibles with Latin ones.

Priests are forced to separate from their wives.

Church buildings changed to be more Catholic.

Protestants are burnt if they refuse to change their beliefs.

Elizabeth I-
1558 - 1603

A Protestant, but she was more interested in people obeying her than what they believed.

Becomes Supreme Governor of the Church.

Changes the church services and Bible to English.

Allows priests to marry

Church buildings are a mixture of Catholic and Protestant.

Some Catholics and Protestants didn't like Elizabeth trying to be fair.
